2. Registration

Registration will be via PH Online **at the PHDL only**. Please register for the course ASB4EN6SBP Sprach-beherrschung' (Keplinger/ Kreutner/ Mayr-Hilgartner/ Stainthorpe/ Wiesinger).

Registration is possible as soon as your marks for the **required prerequisite courses** (**Modules E B 5: Approaching C1 and E B 6: Consolidating C1**) have been put into PH Online, this includes your mark for the course E B 6.2 PS Written Production II (4th semester).

3. Examination format and assessment

The 'Fachprüfung Sprachbeherrschung' consists of:

1. Oral exam (50% of the final grade):

- a. Preparation (15 min): two prompts to choose from, you may use a monolingual dictionary
- b. Exam (5 min): presentation based on a short prompt (cf. Spoken Academic Production) in front of two examiners, you may use flashcards
- c. Assessment and feedback (5 min): based on CEFR C1

The exact exam schedule will be made available three days before the exam at the latest!

You can only take part in the written C1-exam once you have passed the oral part.





2. Written exam (50% of the final grade):

- a. Writing (25%): text types are argumentative essay, descriptive text, letter or email of complaint, as well as a blog response. Students may use one monolingual dictionary for the writing task. 400 words.
- b. Language in use (25%): grammar & vocabulary

To obtain a positive mark on the written exam, both parts (a. writing AND b. language in use) must be positive! If you fail the written part only, you do not have to do the oral part again.

4. Grades and feedback

Your final grades will show on PH Online within a month after you sat the exam. Office hours in which you can look at your exam paper and receive feedback on the written part of the exam will be offered after grading has been completed.
